Payment Protection Insurance.	Dom's PTC shot in and around a bank branch - making use of the many different positions / roles (at the cash point, in the queue, behind the counter) to mix up the visuals.

(WHEN ACTUALLY TALKING TO PEOPLE) ** You've got experience saying the same thing over and over again - fancy coming round to read the Gruffalo to my kids? I can't hack it another 25,000 times ** You're highly experienced at cold calling - ever considered REALLY cold calling? There's a call centre in the Arctic Circle I hear are looking. Rent's pretty cheap up there. ** Persistence, resilience, and an inability to understand just how hated you are. Have you thought about a career as a Chugger? ** Traffic Warden? ** Estate Agent? ** MP? ** Banker? ** Used Car Salesman? ** Door to Door Door Salesman? ** Door to Door Piers Morgan? ** Game of Thrones Writer? ** Are you sure you don't want to be an Estate Agent? I really do think it'd be a great fit.
